Survey Regarding Possible Combination ALCon 2017/ Total Solar Eclipse

As many of you probably already know, several areas of the United States are on the center line for the late August 2017 total solar eclipse, including the state of Kentucky, the Kansas City area in Missouri, Casper Wyoming, etc.

Lowell Lyon, with the Salt Lake Astronomical Society, has successfully chaired or co-chaired two previous AlCons and has volunteered to lead the effort to hold a joint ALCon/Total Solar Eclipse viewing event in Casper, Wyoming, located on the center line of the eclipse. There are just a few seconds less of totality in Casper than in points further east. One of the major benefits of the Casper area is a better probability of cloudless skies for the event.

We want to make a decision fairly soon as Lowell would like to schedule well-known solar speakers early for the convention. ALCORS, please share this information with your members and encourage them to respond to our survey now posted on the League website www.astroleague.org
