- 1. Submit the entry packet consisting of the nominee's research report and this nomination form in electronic format (adobe acrobat pdf files) to <u>NYAA@astroleague.org</u>.
- 2. Submit a photo of the nominee, preferably in an astronomical setting in jpg format to NYAA@astroleague.org. Photos showing the winning nominees may appear in the Reflector, on the Astronomical League website, or on the Astronomical League Facebook page.
- 3. **If electronic submission is not an option**, please send an email regarding this to NYAA@astroleague.org, then mail four entry packets by way of the postal service to NYAA, Astronomical League, 9201 Ward Parkway, Suite 100, Kansas City, MO 64114. (It must be postmarked on or before January 31.)
- 4. Only one project per applicant, please.
- 5. The nominee's work should be original research and your sources should be well-documented in a generally accepted format.
- 6. If the nominee's project was conducted as part of a team effort, the nominee's contribution must be clearly indicated. Not doing so may adversely affect the judging.
- 7. The nominee can not be enrolled in college at the time of the nomination.
- 8. Please refer to the previous year's first place finisher's project as an example. This is posted on the Astronomical League website <u>www.astroleague.org</u>.
- 9. The deadline for submitting the entry is January 31, 2018. If sent electronically, it must be received by the Astronomical League National Office by that date, or, if mailed through the postal service, the postmark must be on or before that date.
- 10. Winning entries will be announced on the Astronomical League website, www.astroleague.org.
- 11. Judges decisions are final.

Entry by two or more members of a research team:

- 1. Team members must select a leader.
- 2. If the team wins, only the leader will be given an expense paid trip to the AL event.

3. Any prizes will be given to the team leader. It will be left to the team to determine their dispositions.
