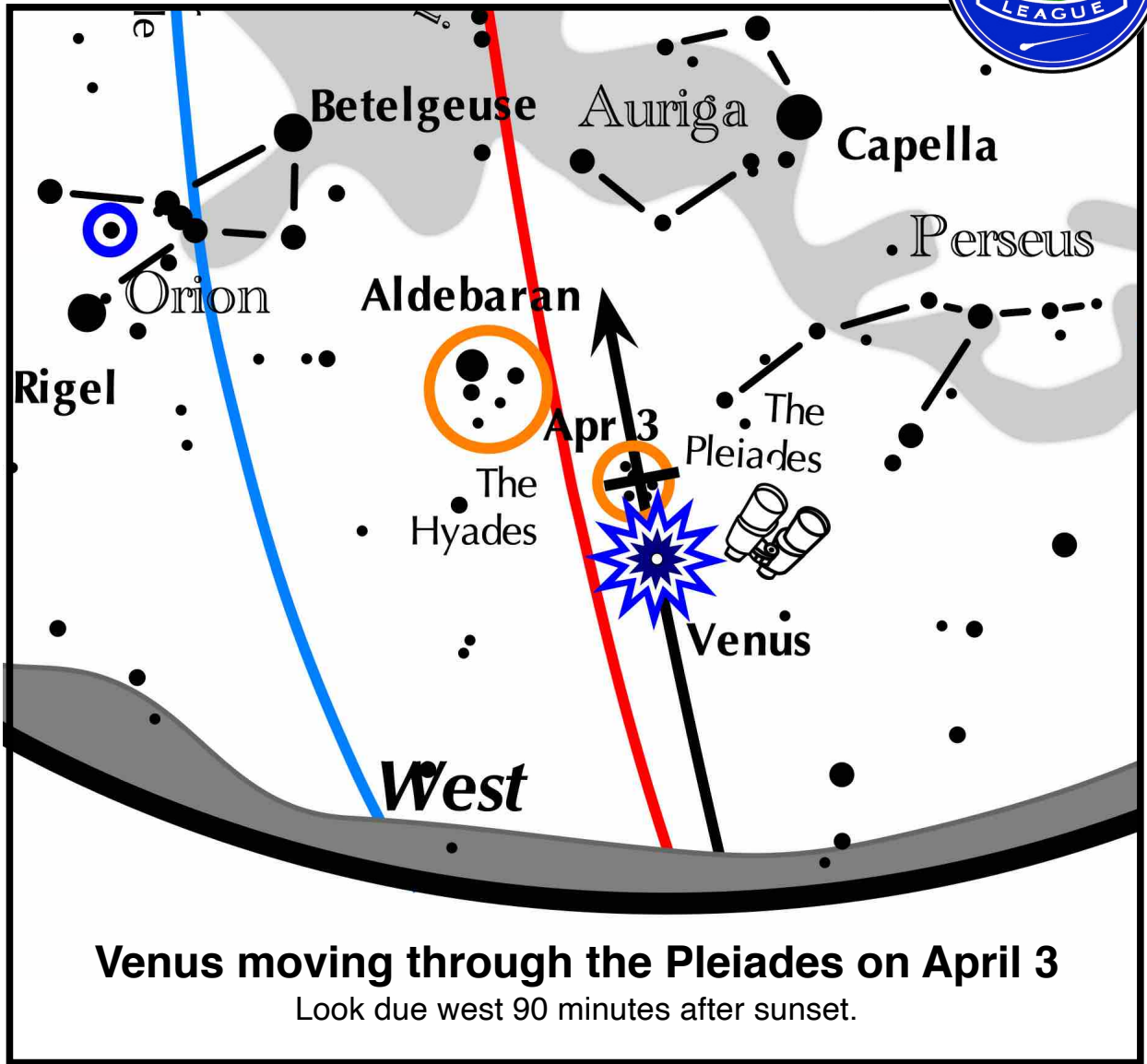


If you can see only one celestial event in the evening this April, see this one.



- Look in the west 90 minutes after sunset on April 3.
- Venus glows in the middle of the delicate Pleiades star cluster.
- The cluster's starlight will be likely blocked by the glare of Venus.
- Use binoculars to reveal the much dimmer stars of the Pleiades.
- The night before and the night after, Venus lies close to either side of the cluster.
